Table 1. Summarised criteria for delirium from recent versions of the *Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders*.^{1,2}

DSM IV-R criteria	DSM-5 criteria
A Disturbance of consciousness with reduced attention	A Disturbance in attention
B Change in cognition or a new perceptual disturbance	C Change in <i>an additional cognitive domain</i> , not accounted for by another neurocognitive disorder
C Acute development (usually hours to days) and tends to fluctuate over 1 day	B Acute development and fluctuation over a day and <i>not solely the result of another neurocognitive disorder</i>
D Caused by a somatic factor, medication intoxication or withdrawal	D <i>Disturbances in A and C must not be occurring in the context of a severely reduced level of arousal, such as coma</i>
	E Caused by a somatic factor, medication intoxication or withdrawal
